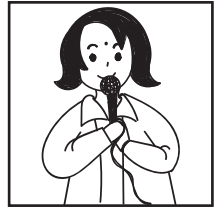

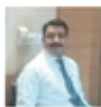

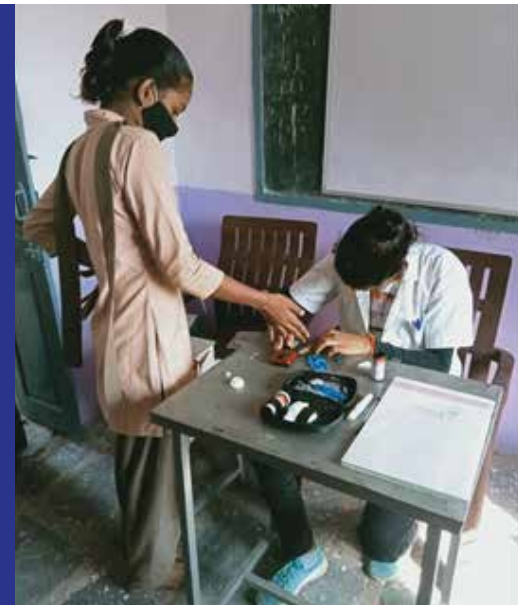
Inauguration

Deepak Medical Foundation, in collaboration with Rotary Club of Baroda Sayajinagari inaugurated the Physiotherapy unit at Deepak Medical Foundation, Nandesari with a vision to treat all ailments under one roof as a part of transforming DMF into multispecialty Hospital. Mr. Santosh Pradhan was the Chief Guest for the event. Ms. Ila Mehta, Ms. Archana Joshi, Director Deepak Foundation, Dr. Riddhi Mehta and Ms. Rachna Parekh, Rotary club president also graced the occasion. Other dignitaries from Deepak Nitrite, Deepak Phenolics and Deepak Foundation were also present for the event.



RAJASTHAN

As per recent studies, it is envisaged that the prevalence of anaemia among adolescent girls is 59% with the majority of study subjects having mild to moderate anaemia. Total of 188 adolescent girls from Kantharia, Anwalheda, Suwarniya, Ganeshpura and Munga Ka Kheda in Chittorgarh district (Rajasthan). This limits their development, learning ability, reduces concentration in daily tasks, increases their vulnerability to infection, increases school dropout rates, reduces physical fitness and work productivity. To make girls aware of nutritional anaemia and ill effects of the same, awareness sessions are being conducted at different government schools.



Looking at the global prevalence of diabetes, there is rise in cases from 4.7% to 8.5% among the adult population. Looking into the seriousness of this ailment, the Mobile Health Van team in Rampura Agucha Mines, Chanderiya Smelter and Zawar Mines from Bhilwara, Chittorgarh and Udaipur districts respectively organized awareness sessions. Nearly, 123 locals were screened during the awareness sessions.



The objective of the Continuing Medical Education programme is to provide opportunities to update knowledge, skills and practices of health professionals. The Continuing Medical Education programme was conducted in nearly 10 Districts of Madhya Pradesh with a goal to brief and orient the Private Medical Practitioners about the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme, the objective of Deepak Foundation in Elimination of Tuberculosis and the responsibilities of all Private Medical Practitioners is diagnosing and treating Tuberculosis patients. The main aim of the CME was to orient the Private Practitioners on their role of notifying Tuberculosis Patients on the NIKSHAY Portal to ensure that every patient seeking treatment from Private Sector is notified to the Government Portal so that all patients get benefits of the NIKSHAY Poshan Yojana wherein the patient receives Rs.500 per month for nutritional support and the Private Practitioner receives Rs.500 for notification of the patient on the NIKSHAY Portal.

The major Private Medical Practitioners diagnosing and treating Tuberculosis patients along with the Indian Medical Association of the particular District are invited in the CME along with the District Tuberculosis staff. It is an interactive session wherein the latest updated guidelines on prevention, treatment and cure of Tuberculosis are discussed. This is a major step for involving all major stakeholders to eliminate Tuberculosis by 2025 as per National Strategic Plan.
