Creating impact at grassroot level



Six-year-old Vanshika Manojbhai Chudasama resides in Poicha village, Vadodara. There are five members in her family. She has a younger brother who is 9 years old, and her mother and grandmother are homemakers. In her household, her father is the only source of income. Her father is a tailor by trade. The family's annual income is around Rs 46,000. Deepak Foundation extended assistance through the Project Sangaath initiative. The team also gathered information about their dwellings during the Sangaath project eligibility survey. Upon visiting her residence, the team ascertained that Vanshika qualified for one of these programmes Sukanya Samruddhi Yojana.

The parents were briefed by the Sangaath team about the plan. Vanshika can withdraw 50% of the amount by the time she is 18 years old and can withdraw the remaining 50% by the time she is 21 years old.

After that, the account will be terminated. In the case of marriage, full amount is received. There are interest rates as high as 8.2%. The Central Government offers a minor savings programme for daughters known as the Sukanya Samruddhi Yojana under the aegis of Beti Bachao – Beti Padhao Yojana flagship. The team completed the application after briefing them about the program's advantages.

Sangaath team assist for widow pension benefits

Kokilaben Arjunsinh Gohil, a resident of Somnath Nagar, Angadh village, Vadodara, is 44 years old. She belongs to a family of three members, with herself being the housewife and illiterate. One of her sons works as a casual labourer, while the other son does not contribute much to the family's income. The annual income of the family is approximately Rs. 75,000, and they reside in a makeshift hut.

Project Sangaath has been providing guidance and assistance to people regarding various government schemes. During the eligibility survey conducted as part of the Sangaath Project, Kokilaben's household information was collected, and she was issued an Adhikar Card. Kokilaben attended a small group meeting organized by the Sangaath team in Somnath Nagar where she was informed about widow pension and availing the benefits of the scheme.

Upon further assessment, the Sangaath team determined that Kokilaben was eligible for the "Indira Gandhi National Widow Pension Scheme." They provided her with detailed information about the scheme and the necessary documents Sangaath team assisted Kokilaben in preparing all the required documents. The facilitator filled out the application form for the "Widow Pension Scheme" and submitted.



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Transforming Agriculture: Farmer's evolution through innovation

In the village of Kukarda, Chhota Udepur where long-standing farming customs prevailed, an inspiring tale of change took shape. Nanjibhai Dubhil, a seasoned farmer with five decades of experience, embarked on a journey that would redefine not just his own life but also the future of agriculture in his community.

Nanjibhai faced familiar challenges in the realm of traditional farming. The repetitive cropping cycles led to diminishing yields, and financial constraints posed additional obstacles on his path. Trapped in a cycle of stagnation, Nanjibhai longed for a transformation that would rejuvenate his land.



Nanjibhai's pivotal moment arrived with the initiation of the Sanrakshan Watershed Project. Confronted with the looming threat of soil erosion, he took the courageous step of building a stone bund on his land, survey No. 159. This 24.5 cubic meter structure acted as a shield against erosion and symbolized Nanjibhai's resolve to carve a new path. The fruits of his labor became apparent after the initial monsoon season. Nanjibhai observed a tangible outcome - a decrease in soil erosion. The financial rewards were equally noteworthy, earning him ₹12,000 in labor fees.

This triumph signified not only a financial victory but also ignited a fresh passion within him. The watershed program also introduced Nanjibhai to a completely new opportunity - dragon fruit cultivation. Despite his background in cotton and toor cultivation, he embraced this unexplored territory. The promise of dragon fruit's potential sparked his curiosity, leading him to embark on

this innovative journey.

The venture into dragon fruit cultivation demanded more than just enthusiasm, it required funds for acquiring the necessary cultivation poles. Nanjibhai's dedication remained unwavering. Using his earnings from the stone bund project, he procured the poles, showcasing his dedication to change and progress. With dragon fruit saplings provided by the Sanrakshan Jalstrav Vikas Samiti, Nanjibhai delved into this horticultural pursuit. His openness to learning and adapting was remarkable, highlighting a notable departure from his traditional practices. The strenuous task of reconstructing the stone bund once again earned him Rs. 12,000, which he reinvested into the dragon fruit initiative. Nanjibhai connected with the horticulture department in Chhota Udepur, and he will receive an incentive subsidy of Rs. 1,35,000 for dragon fruit farming from the Government's Horticulture Department.

Nanjibhai's journey demonstrates how taking initiative and being innovative can lead to transformation. His stone bund project not only protected his land but also paved the way for him to start growing dragon fruit. This shift not only increased his sources of income but also motivated other farmers in Kukarda to consider new approaches. *Lessons Learned:* As the dragon fruit plants thrive, Nanjibhai's optimism grows. In about a year, he will start reaping the rewards of his hard work in the form of a promising income. His achievements and the path he have forged showcase his perseverance and highlight the untapped potential in traditional farming communities.

Parth shines as an example, credits Sankul for his achievements

Upon arrival at the institution, Parth Makwana was enrolled in the 11th-grade commerce stream. His family was comprised of 3 brothers and 2 sisters. His mother abandoned them without any information, and his father's drinking problem made the children fearful of staying with him. His elder sister admitted the 3 brothers to Bal Gokulam Institute in the year 2010. Parth was in class 4th at that time, faced numerous hardships and worried about his bleak future. This led the child to focus on studies, resulting in a transfer from Bal Gokulam to Juvenile Children's Home (Shastri Bridge) and later to Samaj Suraksha Sankul, Deepak Foundation on in 2017.

Adapting to the new environment, the child expressed his desire to succeed but was occasionally disturbed by personal issues, hindering his progress. The counselor provided guidance and encouragement, helping the child integrate into the organization, engage in activities, and excel in endeavors such as creating a cooler from waste material.

Recognized for his diligence and conduct, he was appointed as a committee member to mentor students. Proficient in computers, he assisted with data operations, earning a stipend of Rs. 3000. Encouraged by this, he pursued further education with Sankul's support, displaying gratitude for the assistance. Additionally, he assisted in caring for younger students and managing student files, leading to being honored as the Best Student at the Annual Function and subsequently elected as President of the organization. Alongside his accomplishments at Sankul, he secured employment at Policy Pvt. Ltd., starting at Rs. 16,000 per month with a subsequent salary raise to Rs. 20,000 per month. Noteworthy achievements included owning a house in the Gotri area and diligently repaying the loan.





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
